September 3, 2019

A meeting of the Township of Ocean Sewerage Authority was held on the above date at the Authority Administration Building, 224 Roosevelt Avenue, Oakhurst, New Jersey.

Chairman Galvin called the meeting to order and all recited The Pledge of Allegiance.

The Chairman announced that the Meeting was being held in conformance with the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975 and that adequate notice has been duly posted where required and mailed to the Asbury Park Press and the Coaster in accordance with the law.

WORK SESSION

<u>Executive Directors Report.</u> The Director reported that he has updated the list of future projects after reviewing ideas with the staff. He provided the updated list to the Board members.

Mr. Schmeling advised that he re-noticed the meeting scheduled for September 17, which will be a joint meeting with members of the Council.

Attorney's Report. Mr. Bonello was unable to attend this meeting. In his absence, the Executive Director reported that Mr. Bonello had sent a letter to the Township to advise them that TOSA was not required to obtain variances for proposed projects, but we have not yet received a response.

Operations Manager Report. Mr. Kwityn advised that a part-time employee was hired to set up the Lucity program. He has made progress in updating TOSA's list of assets.

He noted that the employees have been able to make some repairs to the jet truck. The new truck should be delivered by Thanksgiving.

Review of resolutions. The Executive Director provided a review of the resolutions on the agenda.

Jack Kearns, a reporter from <u>WORD on the Shore</u>, was present at the meeting. He asked about the SCADA system, and the Chairman provided an explanation as to how the system works. He also asked about TOSA's membership in the JIF. Mr. Schmeling explained that this membership reduced the cost of TOSA's insurance.

BUSINESS SESSION

<u>Communications.</u> Mr. Schmeling received a request from an engineering firm asking about the location of the sewer lines at the corner of Poplar Avenue and Deal Road.

In addition, a member of the Poplar Village Association board came in to advise that the Association is trying to purchase a piece of property from the Township to build a community center. The last one was destroyed during Sandy. He wanted to know

where the sewer line was located. Since there is no line close to that property, it would be necessary to run a new line.

Review of Bill List. The bill list was reviewed and discussed.

Operation Manager's Report September 2019

Operations:

Interlaken Pump Station progress meeting on August 16. No issues

Met with Monmouth County Road Engineer on August 19 to discuss Interlaken Pump Station driveway. They will allow driveway to be installed where we need it. The said it is allowed to be 30 feet wide. We will do this work towards the end of the stations upgrade completion.

JIF safety inspection was on August 29.

Made good progress with the Lucity program. Mike has taken a good approach to this system.

EMI now has the control room gutted out and started installing new equipment inside. Also, they have most of the overhead supports in place.

In the next couple of weeks, the new See-Plex pump will be installed.

September 3, 2019

The 70 horsepower VFDs are here and they too will be installed. These will go on the sludge mixing pumps for the sludge holding tank.

Morehouse Engineering should soon have the iFix program up and running. This will have all the Secco software gone and all Scada on the same platform.

Worked with Matt from EMI, installed new spare fiber optic connections in RTU cabinets.

Worked with Artie from EMI in control building, rerouted control circuits and

Disconnected old Autocon & MCC. This was all part of the electrical upgrade being done.

Worked with Matt from Morehouse Inc. on Scada issues in the RTU cabinets.

Worked with Frank from Sq. D. with warranty work. Replace the VFD on

mixer # 120.

Installed new power supply in RTU cabinet in the main pump building.

Disconnected odor unit at Whalepond Pump Station.

Installed new GFCI outlet at Whalepond Pump Station for the Wet Well Wizard system.

Installed new T-box battery for Rolling Meadows Pump Station.

Repaired light at Interlaken Pump Station.

Plant:

Wasted sludge for the month of August, 1,800,000 gallons, pre-thickened.

Thickener sludge removed, 350,000 gallons about 80,000 gallons directly to trucks.

Sludge hauled 114 trucks 750,000 gallons.

Percent removal is at 97 with a TSS of 6. All numbers and results are approximate, but well within permit.
